

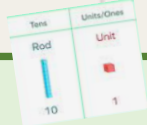


IPC

In our topic 'From A to B' we will explore different transport methods, look at how we travel to school and use maps to record our journeys for Geography. In History we will use different sources to explore transport in the past and look at timelines of when different types of transport were invented. In Science we will plan and implement a simple test to explore air resistance. For Design Technology we will design and evaluate our own vehicle and then test how well they work. For our Art lessons we will look at capturing movement in art and impressionist styles.

English

Our focus texts this term are Grandad's island, Aesop's Fables and Mrs Noah's Pockets. The children will be learning to structure and punctuate different sentence types, recognise word classes and use descriptive vocabulary. They will create character descriptions and learn how to write poems. The children will be encouraged to reflect on and edit their work.



Maths

We begin with 'Place value' this term. A great start to the year, refreshing the fundamentals by counting and subsidising groups of objects accurately, reinforcing numbers to 20 and recognising tens and ones within 2-digit numbers to 100. We will use this knowledge to move onto 'Addition and Subtraction', understanding mathematical symbols, language and exploring part-whole models.
