Numeracy

The focus this term has been on multiplication and division. The children will learn how to multiply and divide by 10,100 and 1000. We are moving on to length and perimeter.

Times tables should be learnt up to 12x12.

This will involve problem solving, so it is important to be able to recall times tables quickly.

Children will also learn how to estimate and check answers.

PE

Our PE days will be Monday and Wednesday, although occasionally we may ask you to wear PE kit on a different day. This half term we will be developing our gymnastic and functional fitness skills.

IPC

We will be learning about solids, liquids and gases and how things can change state. We will need to be scientists to investigate the chemistry of some cooking and preparation processes. We will use our knowledge to make butter, cheese, and milkshakes. What has cooking got to do with science? Do you have any idea of how to make butter?
